



## **ABOUT THE PROJECT**

The CLEANSE Project aims to clean 70% of the garbage from 20 water bodies in Ho Chi Minh City, while raising public awareness about the critical issue of water pollution. The project focuses on three major rivers (Saigon, Dong Nai, and Nha Be) and 11 inner-city canals, covering an area of 835 hectares along these approximately 20,000 residents. approximately 80,000 residents living along these waterways. By addressing both the physical cleanup of water bodies and the root causes of pollution through education, the project seeks to foster a cleaner, healthier environment for local communities.

Through its planned actions, this project aims to contribute to the following SDGs:









# **KEY ACTIVITIES**

### **Water Body Cleanups**

Regular cleaning of water bodies, installation of garbage buoys, and use of microbial bombs to sanitize and deodorize polluted areas.

#### **Awareness Campaigns**

Educational campaigns to involve 4,000 community members and local agencies, empowering them to take action against water pollution.
